

Natrasol is a highly refined natural liquid seaweed concentrate made from fresh kelp stems (*Durvillaea potatorum*) collected from the west coast of Tasmania, capturing the richest source of natural growth stimulants of any seaweed in the world.

The natural balance of trace minerals in Natrasol are naturally chelated (bonded) within organic compounds and easily broken down by plant and soil systems making it an ideal supplement.

It also contains mannitol, a natural chelating agent that can “unlock” unavailable minerals from the soil.

Foliar fertilization causes the plant to pump more sugars and other exudates from its roots into the narrow region of soil (rhizosphere) to influence root secretions and beneficial soil microorganisms.

In turn, this enhanced biological activity, increases the availability of nutrients, disease-suppressive bio-chemicals, vitamins, and other factors beneficial to the plant.

For optimum plant uptake, spray Natrasol early in the morning or in the cool of the afternoon when most of the nutrients and growth regulators will be in the sap stream within the first hour of foliar application.

Do not apply Natrasol + Plus or any other fertiliser containing elevated nitrogen levels during periods of frost danger.

APPLICATION RATES AND TIMING

TIMING	RATES
Canes 10-15cm	3L/ha for increased rachis stretch
14 days after 1st application	3L/ha for increased rachis stretch
3-5 days pre bloom	3 L/ha for increased fruit set if desired
14 days after 3rd application	3 L/ha for increased fruit set if desired
Veraison	2.5 L/ha to improve uniformity of colour, size and shape
Post-harvest	2.5 L/ha to stimulate root growth and general plant tonic for the following season
